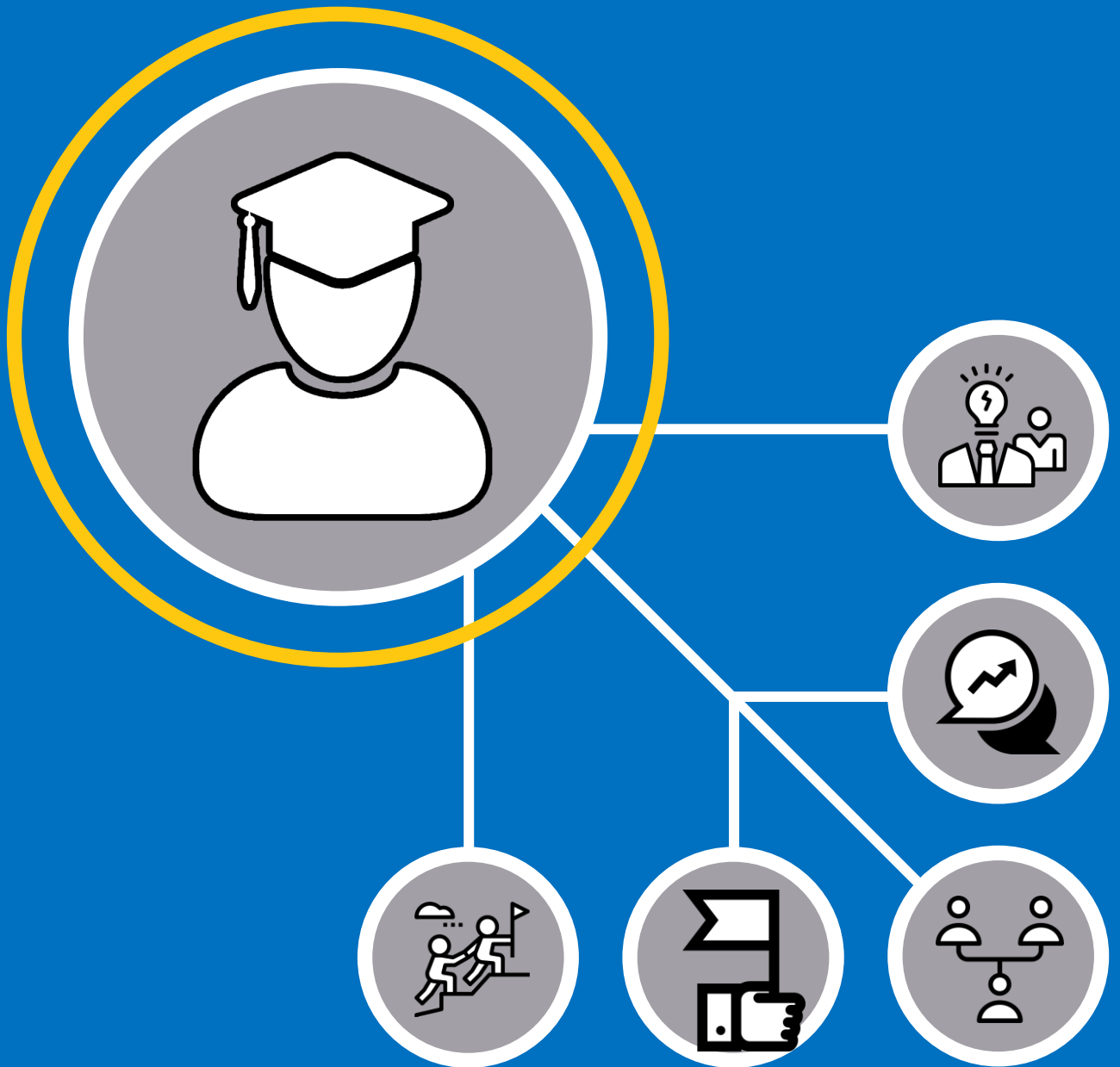

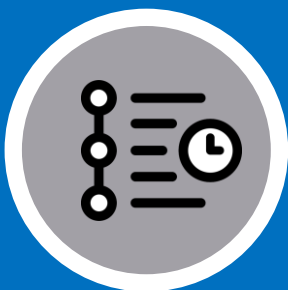
THE APPLICATION PROCESS



LAUNCH ASSEMBLY: Year Group assemblies

THE TIMELINE:

- Week 1: Promotion in tutor groups
- Week 2: Applications to Miss Colebourn
- Week 3: Year groups to vote for their reps
- Week 4: Letter of confirmation to parents
- Week 5: Student council members presented to year group and whole school.



ROLES IN THE STUDENT COUNCIL:

At the first student council meeting, nominations and the following roles assigned for the Yr 10 students;

- Secretary
- PR Officer/Communication

Year 7-9 students will make up the satellite groups;
