Non-Emp Training (FT) – Includes full time provider-based foundation learning and supported internships.
Emp (FT) inc. Apprenticeship– Includes full time jobs with training (nb employed and self-employed) and apprenticeships.
EET (no RPA) inc. PT Emp – Includes full time jobs without training and part-time education/ employment/ training.
NEET - Available – Unemployed but potentially available for work.
NEET - Not Available – Unemployed and unavailable for work, e.g. young carers and asylum seekers.

The data relating to the gender of the young people only includes those people who consented to having their gender recorded. As such the totals may not match the expected cohorts where a gender isn't logged.
The cohort for the Activity Survey is based on the previous year 11 September Guarantee cohort. The contents of this Activity Survey booklet will therefore differ from other school statistics published on government websites that are compiled using a different cohort.

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# Introduction

This booklet has been put together by the Youth Analysis Service (YAS) for schools and academies (referred to as establishments in this booklet) across Hampshire. It provides key figures for young people who completed Year 11 on 31st August 2020.

The topics covered in this report are based on the performance measures used by the Department for Education (DfE). Figures are given at establishment and Local Authority (LA) level.

This booklet acts as a resource for establishments to monitor their current performance, to plan future strategies and to spot potential issues before they arise.

This booklet is based on a cohort of young people who were recorded as being academically aged Year 11 and in an establishment in Hampshire as of 31st May 2020. The data relating to the cohort is a snapshot of their status as of 1st November 2020.

The following data and information in this booklet has been compiled from the Client Caseload Information System (CCIS) used by the Youth Support Service (YSS) in Hampshire. The content is generated by a program designed to identify the destinations, as of 1st November 2020, of young people who completed Year 11 in the academic year 2019/20.

Due to Raising the Participation Age (RPA) legislation, as of summer 2014, young people are under a duty to participate in education or training until at least their 18th birthday, although in practice most young people continue until the end of the academic year in which they turn 18 (academic Year 13).

This is an important piece of education legislation with particular relevance to vulnerable young people. As a high performing education sector, nine out of ten young people in Hampshire already progress successfully to post 16 education and training. Due to this legislation, it is now even more important that our services support all young people with participating in post secondary education. Primary responsibility for providing independent and impartial careers guidance on participation options now rests with establishments directly.

# Raising the Participation Age (RPA) Summary













Graph 6 shows that the general trend across Hampshire is for the majority of both genders to go on to post 16 education, with Sixth Form College/School being the more common destination. This is to be expected as a result of the balance of Sixth Form Colleges/Schools and FE Colleges in Hampshire.

The percentage of Year 11 leavers not meeting RPA requirements (nb in a non-participating destination or 'Other' destination) is low for both genders (7% for males and 5% for females).



## Hampshire September Guarantees and RPA Met


September Guarantees should give Year 11 leavers the opportunity to enter a destination that meets RPA. The height of the bars on graph 12 show the percentage of young people who received a September Guarantee. The colour of the bar shows the proportion of those young people who are now in a destination that meets RPA. The majority of people who had a guarantee went on to meet RPA, which shows the effectiveness of the September Guarantee process.

Table 12 compares the number of Year 11 leavers who had a September Guarantee with the number now in a destination that meets the RPA requirements at LA level (see appendix for the destination types that count as 'RPA Met').

## Establishment September Guarantees and RPA Met




Tables 14a and 14b show that overall the majority of Year 11 leavers do go on to a destination that matches their intended destination.


