THE STUDENT LIBRARIANS' BOOK OF THE MONTH (CHOSEN BY JOSHUA AB)

December: *As Good As Dead* by Holly Jackson (T+)

Pip Fitz-Amobi is haunted by the way her last investigation ended. Soon she'll be leaving for Cambridge University but then another case finds her... and this time it's all about Pip.

Pip is used to online death threats, but there's one that catches her eye, someone who keeps asking: who will look for you when you're the one who disappears? And it's not just online. Pip has a stalker who knows where she lives. The police refuse to act and then Pip finds connections between her stalker and a local serial killer. The killer has been in prison for six years, but Pip suspects that the wrong man is behind bars. As the deadly game plays out, Pip realises that everything in Little Kilton is finally coming full circle. If Pip doesn't find the answers, this time she will be the one who disappears...

Josh describes *As Good As Dead* as the best yet in the series, as well as being a fantastic stand-alone novel with a winding plot will keep you wanting to read on. Anyone who loved the first two books in this series (*A Good Girl's Guide to Murder* and *Good Girl, Bad Blood*) will not be disappointed by Jackson's excellent final instalment.





Scholastic Book Fair

December is 'Read a New Book' month - below we have some reading challenges for you to try this month. Can you complete one of the challenges below before you come back to school in January? Or even all of them?







AUHOR OF THE MONTH


December's Fiction Focus is 'Read a New Book Month'

Enola Holmes Series, Nancy Springer


MRS IRELAND'S RECOMMENDED READS CONTINUED

Rebel Skies, Ann Sei Lin

Kurara has never known any other life than being a servant on board the Midori, but when her party trick of making paper come to life turns out to be a power treasured across the empire, she joins a skyship and its motley crew to become a Crafter. Taught by the gruff but wise Himura, Kurara learns to hunt shikigami - wild paper spirits who are sought after by the Princess.

But are these creatures just powerful slaves, or are they beings with their own souls? And can a teenage girl be the one to help them find their voice - and change the course of an empire?

Rebel Skies is a perfect read for anyone who loves a bit of fantasy and magic. It's beautifully written but still pacy and full of adventure. Great for fans of Harry Potter and His Dark Materials.



Heartstopper Series (T+)

Charlie and Nick are at the same school, but they've never met ... until one day when they're made to sit together. They quickly become friends, and soon Charlie is falling hard for Nick, even though he doesn't think he has a chance.

But love works in surprising ways, and Nick is more interested in Charlie than either of them realised.

Heartstopper is about love, friendship, loyalty and mental illness. It encompasses all the small stories of Nick and Charlie's lives that together make up something larger, which speaks to all of us.



