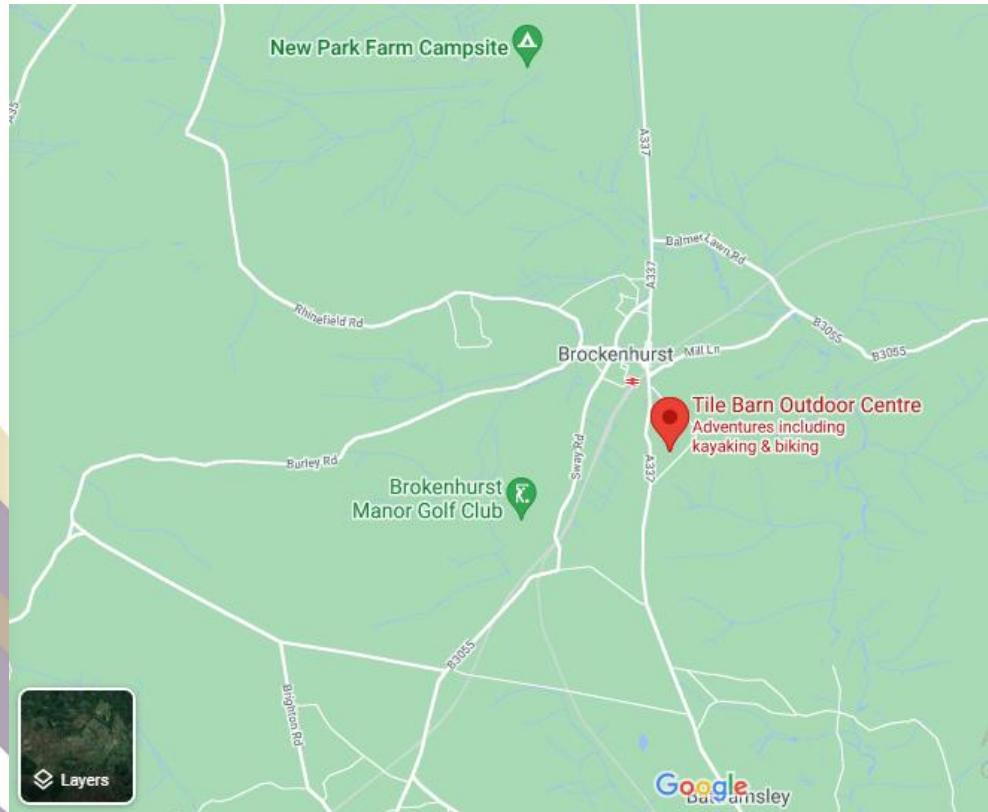

# Kit List

- A large holdall or rucksack (not a suitcase). Soft bags are easier for the coach
- A range of light and warm clothes for a variety of activities
- Towel
- Wash bag
- Sun cream (high factor) and hat
- Waterproof jacket
- Sensible footwear to walk in and for activities.
- Small day rucksack to carry drinks etc
- Book, cards etc.
- Plastic bag for dirty/wet washing
- Spending money (maximum of £10 in coins)

# Mobile Phones

- This year camp will be a mobile phone free experience during certain times of the day; this is to maximise the students experience at Camp.
- We are encouraging students to not bring a phone as there is no charging, minimal signal and we really want students to immerse themselves into camp. The school also will take no responsibility of damage towards these devices as they are bought at their own risk.
- If a student decides to bring their phone, they will be allowed to use these in the morning after breakfast for 30 minutes then they will be handed in to their lead member of staff then after dinner they will have access to these for 60 minutes then they will be returned to their dedicated member of staff.
- If a student wants to contact home at any time during the trip they are welcome to do so through Mr Donaldson's school phone. Likewise, if any parent would like to speak to their child they can call Mr Donaldson.

# Mobile Phones

Students prior to a trip needed to be reminded that The Henry Beaufort School considers the following to be unacceptable use of a mobile device and a serious breach of the school's behaviour policy:

- Bullying, intimidating or harassing any member of the school community by text, email, social media or social media messaging.
- Photographing or filming adults or other students without their knowledge or permission
- Photographing or filming in toilets, changing rooms or similar areas of incidents on the trip
- Posting photos, images and footage on social media, which puts the school into disrepute.
- Refusing to turn off or hand over mobile device at the request of an adult in school
- Using a mobile device in a way that undermines the good functioning of the school/trip e.g. meeting up with peers, asking to leave lessons for the toilet and instead using a device or meeting with friends etc.
- Using a device to contact others during the school day as this causes disruption to teaching and learning.
- Using a device to contact parents/carers instead of through the usual routes of support for all students in school.

# Mobile Phones

In future trips the trip leader, EVC and the Head of Centre will discuss use of mobile devices on the trip and consider a number of factors including:

- Age of students
- Location of residential trip



# Medical Information

All the medical information is held on Arbor, which you will have recently completed, please double check it to make sure it is 100% accurate.

Medication needs to be given to Mr Donaldson on arrival to School in a clear Zip Lock bag, named with information.

If a student requires medication to always be on their person eg. asthma inhalers and EpiPens please ensure that they have these with them at all time and if the school have a spare we will take it with us.

# Medical Information

If your child requires any regular medication, if your child is able to independently take it then that is great. E.g. anti histamines, paracetamol.

But if you child perhaps cannot be trusted to take it or the medication has to be taken at a specific time and you would like the dedicated medical member of staff to hold the medication, please ensure it is handed to Mr Donaldson prior to getting on the bus.

This medication must be clearly labelled with dosage and timings
